

Christina wows the judges with her stunning vocals

BUDDING songstress Christina Warn, from Kingsteignton, will be warming up her vocal chords to perform in two south west singing contests next month.

She won over the judges at Torbay's Got Talent at the Babbacombe Theatre at the auditions with her rendition of Memory, from the musical Cats, on September 18.

She will now have to beat off competition from 11 other contestants to win the title on October 2.

Christina, who works as an admin supervisor to help fund her singing career, also got a thumbs up from judges at the Open Mic UK auditions last month.

After wowing them with her stunning vocals, she will perform in the

regional finals at St George's, Bristol, on October 31.

More than 10,000 hopefuls entered the competition across the country.

'These are the first competitions I've entered, so I am overwhelmed that I've done so well,' said Christina.

'I was really shocked that I got through to the regional final of Open Mic UK as I thought it was aimed at the hip/hop and r'n'b genre.'

From a young age she knew singing professionally was her objective in life

and thanks to having a supportive family, she is well on her way to achieving her goal.

The former Stover School pupil, who sees her vocal coach Tamsyn Rose Steel as her main inspiration, has already recorded an album which includes well known classical numbers and songs from renowned musicals.

Thanks to her singing talent she has already performed as a special guest soloist at a concert with The Callington Singers and was a soloist performing Elgar's Ave Verum in Great St Mary's Church and Trinity Chapel, Cambridge.
